





Lesson Plans:






Procedures:

In 2016, the PBS Team created and implemented two procedures, Transition Procedure and Eating Time Procedure. These procedures proved to have a positive impact on how well students move around the school and eat at lunchtime. In 2017, the PBS Team along with staff and students identified other areas of the school that would benefit from an explicit taught procedure. The three new procedures are Entering Classrooms, Before School and Laptop Procedure.









Logo and Branding:
